Introducing the 1964 World's Fair Chaise Lounge

We are pleased to announce the introduction of the latest park seating model - the 1964 World's Fair Chaise Lounge. This model was developed by the design team at Matthews Nielsen Landscape Architects specifically for the East Side Coastal Resiliency Project in Lower Manhattan.

The designers consulted with our team for careful consideration of manufacturing tolerances and fabrication specifications. Once all the design details were in place we made a steel prototype to test loads on the seating area. With all the final approvals in place, the first iron castings were produced.

The 1964 World's Fair Chaise Lounge is a complementary product to our growing offerings in the 1964 World's Fair collection. The chaise was originally envisioned as a 25" wide single seating element, however this design can also accommodate a double chaise at 50" wide.

In 2025, the chaise lounges were placed north of the pedestrian bridge which connects Corlears Hook Park to the East River Park in Manhattan, positioned to overlook the East River on the east side of the baseball fields, just south of the Williamsburg Bridge.

The 1964 World's Fair Chaise Lounge is available in a galvanized or powder coat finish with your choice of recycled plastic lumber or natural Cumaru.
