FINIALS IN THE GARDEN

FINIAL INSTALLATION

- Materials include cast stone and lead. It is best to use finials in pairs at entries, stairways and to anchor an area.
- Use individually as a focal point, especially when able to be viewed from a distance. Choose a pedestal with a 2-3" reveal from the finial base.
- For smaller finials such pineapples use an adapter to transition to a large pedestal.
- The ornament of a finial can be wider than the pedestal it rests upon.
- For installation prepare at minimum a 12" deep crushed stone pad or pour a concrete footing to frost line.
- Best practice is to securely anchor finials to their bases.





DESIGNING WITH FINIALS AS FOCAL POINTS

We have so many finials that range in ornamentation and style that it would be hard to select a favorite. We do know that when it comes to making a statement the correct size of a finial is crucial to the impact.

Mr. Kenneth Lynch was fortunate enough to have the Virginia based garden designer Charles Gillette as his contemporary, the two collaborated on two exquisite lead urn finial designs which are still in production.

These finials are some of the largest most ornate finials we have seen. Given their size they require special construction for reinforcing. It is details like this which set our products apart from the rest.
