GAME TABLES

UNDERSTANDING THE INSTALLATION

Our concrete tables are constructed with a 4" thick table top which includes a brass and terrazzo playing surface for either chess or backgammon. This heavy top requires secure anchoring.

- <u>Original design</u> 6" diameter concrete post buried 24" below grade in a concrete footing
- <u>Updated design</u> 4" Square steel post buried 24" below grade in a concrete footing
- <u>Surface mounted concrete pedestal</u> with separate table top, assemble on sit.
- <u>Surface mounted 4" square steel post</u> with a 9" square mounting plate. Requires placement on concrete footing and 4 wedge type anchor bolts, the table is only self-standing with anchoring.
- <u>Handicap accessibility</u> for this table design includes an offset steel leg, providing the unobstructed wheelchair depth.
- World's Fair style table base, the surface mounted iron legs coordinate with the 1939 World's Fair benches.
- **Double playing surface table** available as surface mount World's Fair or double steel post.



All tables have a shop applied non-glossy silicone sealant to aid in the removal of graffiti. This also prevents other stains and surface pollutants from settling on the surface. Re-application is recommended every 3-5 years. Game surfaces are available for chess, checkers, backgammon, or blank for dominoes.

PLANNING THE SEATING

- Any of our benches or concrete stools can be used for seating.
- Most concrete stools and concrete leg benches require below grade installation at the same time as the table installation.
- Seating is typically armless to allow easier access to the table.
- Iron benches are surface mounted after concrete installation.
- Two options are available for moveable concrete stools.
- Bench layout typically includes two 4' long benches opposite one another.
- Additional seating layouts include 2' wide chairs on 3 or 4 sides.
- Longer benches can be used, in the case of 8' benches the table is set to one end.
- For handicap accessibility, the table should have one playing side without a seat.
- Chess boards are oriented that the player will have a white square in the right-hand corner.
